1) A PUYALLUP TRIBAL HARVEST MONITOR WILL
ATTACH A BAG TAG TO EACH CONTAINER OF
GEODUCKS AND MAINTAIN RECORDS TO SATISFY
SHELLFISH SANITATION REQUIREMENTS.

2) GEODUCK HARVEST INFORMATION WILL BE
REPORTED TO AFFECTED AGENCIES ON A MONTHLY
BASIS.

DIVER QUOTAS: It shall be the responsibility of each harvester to consult with the Shellfish Office to ascertain his or her IDQ prior to participation in the harvest. The assigned IDQ shall be harvested between April 1, 2021 and September 30, 2021

Due to the carry-over of unharvested quotas from the 2020-21 season, there will be a base quota and a carry-over quota. If a harvester completed their 2020-21 second half quota, they will not be eligible for a carry-over quota.

First Half Seahurst individual base quota is 1,400 pounds

OTHER RESTRICTIONS:

- 1) boat skippers must notify the Puyallup Tribal Police Dispatch by 7:00 p.m. the day before they plan to harvest. (253-680-5656)
- 2) All commercially harvested geoducks must be sold within 24 hours of the close of each harvest day.
- 3) Vessels must anchor no closer than 300' from boundary buoys. Divers must harvest within the tract boundary markers. (no shallower than - 18' corrected to zero tide and no deeper than -70' uncorrected)
- 4) A Puyallup Tribal harvest monitor must be present during the harvest and weigh-out of product.
- 5) All Puyallup Tribal product will be weighed by the Puyallup Tribal monitors on board the harvest vessel. Weigh-out may occur at a designated off-load site if weather does not allow on-water weigh-out (approved site(s) – chinook landing, crows nest, city dock, Totem)
- 7) A harvest vessel may not leave the tract area until the Puyallup Tribal monitor has checked them out and catch data for each harvester has been recorded.
- 8) Harvest vessels must be a minimum of 300 feet apart.
- 9) Harvesters must pay a 10 % tax on all geoducks sold. the tax will be collected by the fish buyer and remitted to the shellfish office.
- 10) The harvest will be halted if bio-toxin levels rise to unsafe levels.
- 11) Harvest vessels may not anchor overnight on or near the tract.
- 12) All divers must present negative results of drug tests to the shellfish department upon request. Random drug tests may be required of all divers at any time.
- 13) Harvesters shall obtain a permit from the director or their designee prior to conducting geoduck harvest.

The following provisions are Covid-19 related

1. Never at any time should there be more than 4 people on a dive boat and 2 on skiff with a total of 6 per crew.
2. Notification of alternating crew members needs to be communicated to the Shellfish Monitors before they leave tract, and upon arriving to tract.
3. Cleaning dive equipment between dives- In terms of sanitation, soap and/or a bleach dilution kills the virus. Use a dip and wash for all equipment between each dive or Clorox wipes and Dawn Dish Soap.
4. It is also recommended that all divers that share a helmet be required to use their own oral nasals and nose guards to protect each other from contamination.

6. All contact with Shellfish Monitors and Buyers will be done by the Boat Captain. They will use face masks and gloves to minimize exposure during all transactions. Initialing for the diver by the monitor on weigh out form is approved (this season only)
7. All divers and crew will be screened daily for temperature and or flu like symptoms. If any are present they will not be allowed onboard.
